What is Phonics?

Phonics makes the link between letters and sounds they make.

Through five phases children will know;

- Letters to sound correspondence (GPC)
- To hear separate sounds in words (segmenting)
- To blend sounds together (blending).



Terminology

Grapheme - A letter or group of letters used to represent a particular phoneme when writing.

Phoneme - The smallest unit of sound.

Segmenting - To identify each of the individual phonemes in a word, working all the way through from left to right.

Blending - To combine individual phonemes into a whole word, working all the way through from left to right.



Pronunciation Phrase - t Open your lips; put the tip of your tongue behind your teeth and press ttt

Formation Phrase - t Down the tiger and across its neck



Pronunciation Phrase - p Bring your lips together, push them open and say p p

Formation Phrase - p Down the penguin's back, up and around its head






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




Examples of books your child may bring home

Week beginning 7th October we will begin reading practice sessions. On the Friday within their book bag they will bring home one of the following books and their reading record.


