Topic

Our topic for the first half term is *Once Upon a Time*. We will begin with the story of the Three Little Pigs which will enable us to investigate materials and their uses before moving on to other traditional tales.

After half term, our topic will change to heroes and adventurers which will be taught through engaging stories, and inspiring world leaders such as Greta Thunberg and David Attenborough. We will also see that Superheroes are within the community, taking care of us and our world. If any parents would like to come in and talk to the children about their job or how they help within the community, we would love to hear from you.

English

Phonics is taught daily using the scheme, Little Wandle Letters and Sounds. This is a fast pace, fun scheme that teaches children to identify letters and their phoneme correspondences.

Alongside sounds, the children will be introduced to High Frequency Words. These are some of the most common words used in the English Language. We aim to hear the children read three times a week through carefully planned reading sessions which model fluency, teach prosody and apply comprehension skills.

As well as guided teaching, our provision will provide enhancements for many reading and writing opportunities throughout our rich curriculum.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development:

We will focus on children's Rights and Responsibilities, applying the Rights and responsibilities hand to ourselves within our home and school.
