6ii	Safeguarding – LM gave a verbal overview of the safeguarding report that had been undertaken with NB. The document had been made available for the GB prior to the meeting on Governor Hub.	
	Q./ A governor asked – will the newly appointed Deputy Head take over the role of DSL (to replace NB)? A./ The safeguarding lead governor and the Head responded – This will be dependent on the skill set of the newly appointed candidate. The governors were advised that the safeguarding team will ensure that this is smoothly transitioned.	

Q./ A governor asked – are there any notable trends in the number of safeguarding reports that are being logged?

A./ The Head responded – There are two main trends that have been seen. There are a number of children that have medical needs and these cross over into the looked after children category. There are a small number of children/families that are in a domestic violence situation and the school offer the correct support and advice for these families. This usually involves the family being referred to the early help team and MASH.

Q./ A governor asked – is the single central record robust?

A./ The safeguarding lead governor responded – there is a comprehensive spreadsheet held on the school system and it is updated on a regular basis.

It was noted that under direction of the local authority a new column had been added in to the single central record to include dates of birth. This is where a case may need to be referred to the LADO (local authority designated officer), dates of birth will enable the pupil in question to be accurately identified.

It was noted that the SCR is password protected, the Head also advised that there will be training on GDPR for the whole staff in summer 2.

A governor also recommended that the level of security and encryption on the SCR spreadsheet should be checked to ensure that there would be a minimal risk to the document being 'leaked'. The safeguarding lead governor did assure the governors that following a county audit the SCR had been given a 'green tick' and the security had not been guestioned.
